With the hot summer months we have those beautiful early mornings. Tuesday get together



Tom Nance contacted Mike Baker about 6 axle unit that he has for sale. Recommended not to purchase. Discussed purchasing a new locomotive and that the Dash 9 was purchased in 2018 and doesn't have a lot of hours on it. Tom Nance and Craig Griffin will research some new engines and report back to the Board

Previously Lil Blue was suggested to be a PR engine for display. They would welcome the engine at City Hall for 6-9 months. Temporally on hold. Chris Donhost and Tom looking into some other options to determine if it is feasible to pursue and the benefit to the club.

SAFETY RULES FOR THE MONTH

1.06 Loading and unloading

All passengers will be loaded and unloaded only at designated passenger stations, or as directed by the crew.

2.08 Water Pumps and Injectors

All steam locomotives shall have at least two devices for transmitting water to the boiler. At least one of these devices shall be operable when the locomotive is not in motion.

3.15 Stopping

During heavy traffic no stopping on the mainline with exception for an emergency or signal. Any train that is stopped or fouling on the mainline must call out a flagman to protect to the rear with a red flag or light that may be clearly seen by a following engineer for a distance of at least 150 feet.

4.02 Requirement of Conductor

All trains hauling passengers shall have at least one qualified Conductor on the last car of the train, or facing backward on the rear seat of the Engineer car. It shall be their responsibility to protect the rear of the train and to assist the Engineer in the operation of the train. Each Conductor on duty shall have a whistle (police type) and a red flag or light on the train.

locomotive is a complete set of castings including a brand new copper boiler. This was all purchased from Railroad Supply when it was owned by Chet Peterson. All the running gear castings have been machined and assembled on the frame, the locomotive is running on air. Twin cross head pumps, original blued sheet metal lagging for boiler. Comes with a complete Railroad supply fiberglas tender tank including frame, trucks etc. All of the drawings are included. The boiler is a copper boiler, never installed to frame as supplied by Railroad Supply and has the original shipping crate. \$6950.00.
