No definitive fault was found except a broken weld joint on the continuously welded rail. A big thank you to Steve for going out during the week to install rail joiners around that broken section.

There are plenty of ties on River Bend which need to be replaced and the track is set to the old tighter gauge but that section of track might be too large of a project to take on before the March public ride season commences.

The second Saturday was a wet one. I spent all morning and used all of Steve's fuel in the leaf blower (thanks!) attempting to keep the track clean while the rain came down. There was minor track flooding near River Bend but I heard no news of derailments.

We still plan to replace the ties in Lower Yard and work days for that will be announced soon.

11.14 Pets

No pets of any kind shall be allowed to run free within the facility. All pets shall be confined on a leash not over 6 feet in length, or inside a crate or pen. The owner of such pets shall be responsible for immediately cleaning up any manure or other disagreeable mess caused by such pet. Any violation of this rule may result in both pet and owner being asked to leave the facility. Animals may not ride on public passenger trains. Owners may be asked not to have their animals ride at the discretion of the station master. Animals must be kept away from any areas of food preparation or consumption.
