So, off my soapbox. We hope to see you at our railroad soon and often!




Track Department by Jeff Burke

Greetings members, The track department has made good progress replacing ties underneath the two switches in Lower yard that are being relocated. We replaced the ties while the turnout was in the ground so we wouldn't disrupt the geometry too much. Big thanks to Kevin

Sach for finishing up the screws in the curved turnout after the outside rail started floating too much on day one. After that, the turnouts were lifted and brought to their new locations for a test fit. A few of the regular track panels have been lifted out and had their ties replaced already but we still have many more to go. Please come out and help replace ties, shovel ballast or help with any other task that our railroad needs. The railroad continues to succeed with your support.

Traditionally our members work day is held on the 3rd Saturday of the month, and we will continue to hold it on that day but, I would like to try utilizing our email system to remind members that we are having a work day or to announce any non-newsletter scheduled work time.

We have had some beautiful cool mornings with days warming mild, and dry. A few steam and



This month's Work Day we hope to start cutting and welding the frame members for our "Maintenance Equipment Building". 

The consist in this photo should look oddly familiar to club members.



SAFETY RULES FOR THE MONTH

3.19 Bad Order Cards

Equipment that is taken out of service shall be tagged for

cause. Tagged equipment must not be operated or coupled to any engines or cars except for repairs or corrections. The bad order card shall not be removed until repair is fixed.

4.04 Responsibilities of Stationmaster

The Stationmaster will have complete charge of the Station. The Stationmaster shall have a whistle (police type), red flag, and flashlight in their possession at all times while acting as a Stationmaster. They shall supervise the loading and unloading of all passengers at the passenger station. They shall discreetly refuse passage to passengers who obviously cannot fit or sit safely on a passenger hauling car. They shall make certain that all passengers have been advised and understand the safety instructions before the train leaves the station. They shall work in close cooperation with other operating personnel to keep passengerhauling trains moving without causing congestion on the mainline.



locomotive is a complete set of castings including a brand new copper boiler.

This was all purchased from Railroad Supply when it was owned by Chet Peterson. All the running gear castings have been machined and assembled on the frame. the locomotive is running on air. Twin cross head pumps, original blued sheet metal lagging for boiler. Comes with a complete Railroad supply fiberglas tender tank including frame, trucks etc. All of the drawings are included. The boiler is a copper boiler, never installed to frame as supplied by Railroad Supply and has the original shipping crate.
