Track Department by Jeff Burke

Greetings members, April was a great month for track work. With the help of many volunteers throughout the month, we were able to finish the east side of our Lower Yard tie replacement project. The repaired ballast car worked great, allowing us to continually run the train from

the work site to the ballast bunker. It only took half a day to drop rock and level the entire track once we got in a groove of dumping the ballast directly from the car end and sweeping it into place while the train went for another load. I'm sure the yard will settle a bit during the meet so we will have to go back over it for leveling after that. We plan to finish the west side of the yard sometime after the meet. Once that is finished we have some other tie replacement projects for small sections of track where the recycled ties have been broken by the steel rail's heat cycles.

A few more small track projects were also completed including, filling in ballast in areas where animals had been digging, adding a small retaining bar for ballast at Twin Bridges, tamping up the track where it was sagging in a few places and installing a throw for the switch that leads into the turntable wye.

Our workday email notices have been gaining momentum and we saw some fresh faces at out workdays. Please check that tracksuper@svlsrm.org is unblocked from your spam, or maybe leave it if you do not want to receive notices.

Please remember that Public Run is May 3rd and 4th. After that we have the Spring Meet, May 16th through 18th. If you can volunteer in anyway, please reach out to Steve or Chris to let them know what position you can cover, even if it is for a few hours.

The weekend before Spring Meet will likely be a work weekend that will include minor track work but mainly clean up of the club property in preparation for our guests. There will be an email to announce the date and time.

Thanks for everyone's help this past month, you all made it possible with your volunteer hours.

He proudly displays his Distinguished Flying Cross, which is for heroism or extraordinary achievement while participating in an aerial flight. Ken was a Navigator on B24 aircraft during WWII and was awarded the

Flying Cross for the longest flight under combat fire during the first daylight raid over Bangkok, Thailand. That



mission was his 50th. Note: Ken donated his "little Blue" steam engine to the club in August 2014.

50Years ago: If you were one of the attendees of the May 3rd & 4th SVLS meet you already know that it was a big success. Twenty locomotives from around the territory were operating and pulling passengers. Engines under construction and several other stationary projects were on display. Including the NMRA Conventioneers, there were several hundred rail fans visiting our Cordova Park track. The highlight was the Saturday Banquet. Our guest speaker was Chet Peterson of Railroad Supply Corp. and he offered a most interesting talk on the interest in Live Steaming around the Country.





Summary of April 14 Board Meeting

Planning for the Spring Meet is progressing. We need volunteers to help put the event on, contact a Board member if you are available to help.

After the Spring Meet we will remove the vines from the Maintenance of Way container, paint the west wall and reattach the vines.

The security cameras are being repaired and coverage expanded.

The winter's track project is completed. It will need to be retapped after the Meet.

We have renewed our insurance policy for 2025. We are working on updated wavers for Meet attended and visitors to sign.

The back door of the library has been damaged. The library has been secured while a replacement door is being constructed.

After the Spring Meet the rule book will be updated. If you have any suggestions please contact a Board member.

The ice maker has been serviced and is working. The water under the caboose is part of the normal operation of the ice machine.

Spring meet planning is continuing. If you have some time available please volunteer during the setup, meet and take down.


The next Board meeting is May 12th. Contact the secretary for an agenda and how to attend the meeting.

SAFETY RULES



1.10 Food and Refreshments

Passengers shall not take food, drinks, or other refreshments other than water aboard any train. Nor may

any person, passenger or crew member, smoke while on board. Dumping of trash while on the train is strictly prohibited.

2.05 Safety Chains A chain, cable or draw bar must be installed between any car on which the Engineer is riding separate from his locomotive. A chain or draw bar must also be installed between any fuel car or cars and the locomotive which it supplies. Some safety device is recommended for all cars.

3.02 Responsibilities of the Conductor

Each conductor shall have a whistle (police type) and a red flag or light in their possession at all times while acting as conductor. They shall assist in loading or unloading passengers on the train. They shall be certain that all passengers on their train have been informed of the safety rules before signaling to the engineer to proceed from the station. They shall enforce all passenger safety rules while the train is in motion. They shall enforce rules and shall prevent any passengers from throwing any trash, garbage or other refuse from the train along the right-of- way. They shall align all switches (turnouts) for the mainline after use of such switches by their train. They shall assist the engineer when necessary and shall call for help when necessary to enforce any rules.

4.03 Length of Train

Trains carrying the general public shall not exceed 100 feet in length over all, exclusive of locomotive and tender or other motive power.
